The legalities

Home Education, whether you are in England, Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland is perfectly legal.

If your child has never been to school or registered with a school then you do not have to inform anyone about your decision.

If your child attends a school then you do need to formally deregister by sending a letter. The actual process varies depending on the area of the UK so please check out our site for full details.

As long as you deregister properly then you will not be prosecuted for truancy.

Special schools require you to write to the Local Authority to request consent for the child's name to be removed from the register. We can support you through this process.

What about socialising?

There are clubs all around the country including Home Ed meet ups, activities such as Scouts, dancing etc. There's no reason your child would miss out on making friends.

If you consider spending all day with the same 30 children versus a wide range of people of all ages, which would you pick?

What about special needs?

Home Education suits children with SEN or disabilities as you can adjust the education to meet their needs, Whether this means scribing for them, allowing them to rest often, creating an environment they feel safe in etc.

Can anyone Home Educate?

Absolutely! You do not need to be a teacher, or even have gained any qualifications.

How do I know what to teach?

Home Educating parents tend not to teach, faciliatating a child's learning would be a better description of what happens.
There are no rules on what a child has to learn, as long as the education is suitable to their age, ability and aptitude you can do what interests the child.

Do we have to be assessed?

No, the law states that it is the parents responsibilty to ensure the education is suitable. The local authority have no duty to monitor the provision. We offer support and advocacy in this,
